Member of the Vilnius City Council, Education and Culture Committee.

"School as the Heart of the Community" with a historical overview of the main ideas of education in connection with economic, social and cultural changes. Elaborating on the 20th century, speaker explains the concept of progressive schools and the idea of lifelong education.

In the 21st century, according to Mr. Radkevicius, the main idea of education should be a school that acts as a community center, where children not only study in classrooms, but also spend time playing outside of school, where adults can also come and learn new skills, and the school building is organically and ecologically integrated into the general landscape of the area. The speaker shows that teaching methodology, architecture and art are closely interconnected. Using the example of schools located in different parts of the world (Estonia, France, Vietnam, the Kingdom of Bhutan), the speaker illustrates why nature and aesthetics play an important role in the education of children.


14:00 PROJECT "BEYOND"

"Godopoco - method and game: How parents discover a common language with children by improvising. How not to be afraid to express what you feel and listen to the feelings of the other."

ANDRIUS ŽEBRAUSKAS

A well-known actor, lecturer and coach. He is the first teacher of theatrical improvisation in Lithuania. In 2009 he founded the improvisation theater "Kitas kampas", which has existed until then.

Andrius For two years carried out the project "Improvisation model: development of communication, self-expression and creative skills of school community members", which was recognized as the "Best Project". Through improvisation, students, teachers, and parents found a way to authentic and spontaneous communication that allowed them to be without social roles and statuses. Their relationship became closer and warmer. More confidence has emerged.

"Godopoco - We learn to express and listen to feedback"

Workshop using method of theatrical improvisation

 $\label{thm:condition} \mbox{Godopoco is a role-playing game that simulates challenging situations}.$

 ${\sf Godopoco}\ is\ a\ method\ for\ developing\ communication\ skills\ and\ emotional\ intelligence.$

In this game there are roles like father and child. An improvised conversation takes place in the chosen situation. When emotions arise, the interaction is stopped and feedback is given immediately - in a disciplined and structured manner.

We learn to express our feedback and listen to partner feedback.

By participating in various roles, the participant has a better understanding of his or her and the child's behavior. Seeing restrictive tactics of one's behavior creates a motivation to change them. The conversation is improvised. There is a lot of freedom here for creativity and experimentation.



15:30 WORKSHOP 2 first round (ELZĖ VAREIKYTĖ)

How does visual communication help us understand each other better?

In this workshop, we will perform several visual communication exercises during which we will practice to listen to each other empathetically. There will be no right answers here, but plenty of room for your reflection. And don't worry - you won't need to show off your great drawing skills! During this hour, a willingness to listen and an open heart are all that you need.
